# 2. FAU Glades Field Restroom Cleaning

At the March 6, 2023, meeting, the Board approved paying for extra restroom cleaning at the Glades Road field at FAU for peak use times over three months. Initially, the cost was \$1491.96 monthly, covering trash emptying, supply restocking, and 22 hours of cleaning each weekend. The fee has risen to \$1,805.61 monthly, totaling \$5,416.83 annually. The cleaning contract, awarded by FAU through a state bid, limits the District's options. Staff recommended continuing the additional services from January 9, 2024, to April 9, 2024, to maintain safe and clean facilities for sports groups using the field.

### **Executive Director:**

Swim & Racquet Center

Surge arrestors were installed at the Swim Center.

#### **District Counsel:**

Mr. Goren examined pending legislation concerning Special Districts, specifically House Bill 7013 and Senate Bill 1058. If approved, these bills might offer the opportunity to present to voters the continuation of the District, propose voter reauthorization, implement 12-year term limits, and conduct performance reviews. Counsel will provide the Board with ongoing updates on the progression of the bills.

## Commissioners:

Commissioner Engel congratulated the re-elected officers and is happy to be associated with all Board members. He extended New Year wishes to everyone and looked forward to a productive 2024.

Commissioner Ehrnst expressed frustration with the slow progress of government projects, noting that everything seems to move at a glacial pace. He would like to revamp the approach to project planning by breaking it down into manageable parts and prioritizing major projects. He believes enhancing park planning and collaborating for upcoming city meetings is crucial.

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Commissioner Rollins believes it would be beneficial to thoroughly evaluate each park for potential improvements and upgrades beyond the basics. He commended the District's dedicated staff for their perseverance and looks forward to collaborating with George Brown, City Manager. He assured Mr. DuKate that there have been no Sunshine Law violations within the District, that the integrity of everyone is unquestionable, and that all decisions are made publicly.

Commissioner Vogelgesang reported that WPTV had a segment on Jordan Ogman and the new Patch Reef Park accessible playground. The Ogman family expressed deep appreciation for the District's decision, made without hesitation, to transform the park into an all-inclusive space.

**Commissioner Wright** thanked the Board for their trust in appointing her as Chair. She pledged to work diligently and effectively in her role and appreciated the Board's vote of confidence.
