MINUTES OF A REGULAR MEETING OF THE BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS December 18, 2023

The MEETING took place at the Swim & Racquet Center and was live-streamed for viewing and listening through Zoom. The meeting was called to order by CHAIR Erin Wright at 5:15 p.m.

CHANGES TO AGENDA:

PUBLIC REQUESTS:

Mr. Robert DuKate expressed gratitude for the well-drafted resolution on public safety. He proposed that District counsel draft a letter regarding the CRA's non-compliance to avoid the expenses of a public records request.

Mr. Harold Chaffee believes that the resolution for public safety is necessary and voiced his opinion at a recent City council meeting.

Mr. Cil Ciliberti advocated for the eighteen covered courts at Patch Reef Park, highlighting the advantages of shaded outdoor courts.

Mr. Douglas Heizer, representing the Rotary International and the Boca Raton Rotary clubs, proposed donating and maintaining a Peace Pole at Sugar Sand Park and any parks in the area if desired.

Mr. Tobias Kay expressed the urgent need to proceed with the pickleball project at Patch Reef Park due to the rapid growth in pickleball demand. He highlighted the importance of covered courts, especially in hotter weather conditions, ensuring increased court utilization and beneficial return on investment.

Mr. Jon Holloway, President, and CEO of the Coastal Stewards, formerly the Friends of Gumbo Limbo Nature Center, shared recent updates and challenges of the nonprofit organization regarding the management of the sea turtle rehab at Gumbo Limbo.

REGULAR BUSINESS:

1. Sugar Sand Park Roof-Change Order

The as-built plans from 1997 indicated plywood for the Sugar Sand Park Community Center Roof, but OS Board was used over the Explorium area instead. This led to a need for longer screws, which were reviewed by the City engineer and found to meet code standards, yet aesthetically, they do not align with District's facility standards. An Advanced Roofing Change Order to restore the roof as initially intended was presented to the Board for consideration. This change would increase the contract amount from \$1,639,586 to \$1,705,675.21. The District plans to allocate the \$50,000 contingency fund toward covering the expenses associated with the change order if approved.

MOTION was made by Commissioner Rollins and seconded by Commissioner Vogelgesang to approve the Advanced Roofing change order for \$116,090.21 to make the repairs at Sugar Sand Park Community Center.

MOTION was made by Commissioner Ehrnst and seconded by Commissioner Engel to award the bid to CSR Construction in the amount of \$7,216,382 for the construction of the pickleball facility, drainage of the tennis courts, and parking expansion.

Mr. Horowitz reminded the Board about the mandatory 4-hour Ethics Training required in 2024 and provided an overview of Pending Bill PCB 24.02 concerning Special Districts. He assured the Board that everyone would be kept updated on the progress of this legislation.

Commissioner Engel met with Marty Haberer, President of the JCC in Boca, and discussed the idea of placing a Senior Center at the old hotel site at North Park. He believes this could be a valuable addition to the area. Mr. Haber was also interested in collaborating with the YMCA for future projects.

Commissioner Rollins is optimistic about ongoing projects and hopes for smoother permitting processes.
