Hopefully, the front cover intrigued you to learn more about the family photographed and their story. This past June, Keeton Nimrod, a 14-year-old from Kansas battling non-Hodgkin's lymphoma, visited the Gumbo Limbo Nature Center with his family to fulfill his wish: to take care of sea turtles. Over a few days, he lived his dream as an Honorary Sea Turtle Technician: going on a Turtle Walk, helping to release sea turtle hatchlings, and providing care and examinations of the turtles in Gumbo Limbo Nature Center's Sea Turtle Rehabilitation Facility. Gumbo Limbo, the Greater Boca Raton Beach and Park District, and the City of Boca Raton have a strong partnership with the Make-A-Wish Foundation of Southern Florida. Over this summer, Gumbo Limbo hosted three other "wishes." During the wish experience—lending a helping hand to our technicians, feeding, and assisting with animal care—a remarkable thing happens: The children see the other side of treatment. They become the doctor, not the patient. This provides perspective and impacts healing. I would like to thank the entire Gumbo Limbo team, including volunteers, for their ongoing assistance in providing amazing experiences for every person (and animal) who visits the nature center.

The other thing you might have noticed in the cover photo is the beautiful artwork at the entrance to the central tunnel located in Spanish River Park. This one-of-a-kind piece, masterfully painted by Tom D'Auria, is one of six unique installations of art. Each of the Spanish River Park beach tunnels was painted by a different local artist, and all the pieces enhance the serenity of nature within the park and the beach. Kudos to the Mayor and City Council, the Art in Public Places Advisory Board, and the Development Services Department for their vision to further enhance our community. I challenge you to take some time to visit Spanish River Park, take a walk, enjoy the artwork, and take a break and a breather from your hectic life. You'll leave refreshed and will believe in the restorative power of nature! Parks have the ability to nurture, heal, inspire, challenge, and capture your imagination! Every day, the 800-plus team members in your Recreation Services Department work hard to provide amenities that enable our citizens and visitors to enjoy the best things about Boca Raton: our green spaces, native preserves, and areas to reconnect with nature.

Finally, you've most likely already seen information on our ongoing Community Needs Assessment. Proof of residency is required daily. At Meadows Park Pool, a Resident resides within the City of Boca Raton, and a Non-resident resides outside the City of Boca Raton.

GENERAL INFORMATION FOR BOTH POOLS

The qualified Aquatics staff is certified through the American Red Cross in Lifeguarding/First Aid, CPR/AED for the Professional Rescuer, Water Safety Instruction, Special Needs Water Instruction, and Administering Emergency Oxygen.

Both Aquatics facilities feature 25-yard long pools that are heated during the winter months and cooled during the summer months to maintain a temperature between 80-83 degrees year-round. Chair lifts meeting ADA regulations are accessible to all patrons requiring assistance. Tables, chairs, umbrellas, and awnings are available. Only U.S. Coast Guard-approved flotation devices are allowed. Mermaid tails are not permitted.

Meadows Park Pool has eight lanes, two one-meter diving boards, charcoal grills, and coin-operated lockers at 50 cents per use.

The Swim Center has six lanes, a spa, a wading pool, a splash pad, and a playground.

AQUATICS PROGRAMMING

H2O BOOTCAMP

No pool at your school? Wish to add something new to your physical education class? H2O Bootcamp is a new student group program being offered at Meadows Park Pool for water confidence and endurance.

The classes focus on improving swimming strokes and techniques with additional group activities and games. After the instructional period has ended, participants have thirty minutes of free time to enjoy the pool.

AMERICAN RED CROSS LIFEGUARDING COURSES

This training course at either facility provides the knowledge and skills to prevent, recognize, and respond to Aquatic emergencies, and to provide care for breathing emergencies, cardiac emergencies, injuries, and sudden illnesses. The course fee includes a hardcopy of the book, pocket mask, and certificate in Lifeguarding, First Aid, CPR, and AED. Participants must be at least 15 years old and be able to complete the pre-course requirements (300-yard continuous swim, tread water for 2 minutes using only the legs, and complete a timed event with a 10-lb brick). At least 4 participants are needed to hold this course.

DEEP WATER FITNESS

Deep water fitness classes at Meadows Park Pool provide an opportunity to receive a cardiovascular workout without impact on the joints. Water buoyancy supports your weight and moving through the water provides resistance and strengthening of the muscles. A flotation belt is required. On the first Monday of each month the class will be held at the Swim Center. The program runs continuously every month year-round. Those interested may attend one class for free. Please register one week prior to the start of the program.

BOCA MANTAS FALL 2019 SWIM TEAM

This Fall swim team for ages 5 to 18 and meets Tuesday, Thursday, and Saturday at Meadows Park Pool. The team is part of the South Florida Recreational Swim League (SFRSL) and competes in swim meets on Saturdays throughout the season and participates in a championship meet. Registration details: For swimmers new to Mantas, a swim test is required. Swim tests can be done during operating hours at either City pool. Swimmers 5-7 years old are required to swim 25 yards freestyle in the shallow end, then 25 yards choice in the deep end without stopping. Swimmers 8 and older are required to swim 50 yards freestyle and 50 yards choice without stopping. Swim tests are not required for returning Mantas. Registration begins on July 12 and continues until the team is full.

SWIM LESSONS

Registration for 2019 swim lessons has begun. Registration will be available for all 2020 swim lessons on December 9, 2019. Patrons may register online at webtrac.ci.boca-raton.fl.us, in person at either facility, or over the phone. Classes are on Saturday mornings for 8 weeks (8 classes) at both facilities, Wednesday and Friday afternoons for 4 weeks (8 classes) at Meadows Park Pool, and Tuesday and Thursday afternoons for 4 weeks (8 classes) at the Swim Center. Two classes per 8-class session will be refunded due to thunder and lightning if two or more classes are affected by thunder and lightning. Classes are not made up due to rain or other weather conditions.

DESCRIPTION OF SWIM LESSON LEVELS

If you are unsure of what level of swim lessons you or your child should be in, please come in for a water assessment.

PARENT AND CHILD AQUATICS

6 months to approximately 3 years. Class size is 3 to 10 students; parent is in the water with child; explore submerging to the mouth, nose, and eyes completely; explore buoyancy on the front and back position; change body position in the water; glide on the front and back with assistance; perform combined stroke on front and back with assistance; explore submerging in a rhythmic pattern.

PRESCHOOL AQUATICS – LEVEL 1

Approximately 4 to 5 years. Class size is 3 to 4 students; front and back glides and recover to a vertical position; back float and recover to a vertical position; roll from front to back and back to front; tread with arm and hand actions; alternating and simultaneous arm and leg actions on front and back; combined arm and leg actions on front and back.

PRESCHOOL AQUATICS – LEVEL 2

Approximately 4 to 5 years. Class size is 3 to 4 students; front and back float or glide and recover to a vertical position; roll from front to back and back to front, tread water using arm and leg actions, finning arm action on back; combined arm and leg actions on front and back; front, jellyfish, and tuck floats; rotary breathing; change direction of travel while swimming on front or back.

LEVEL 1 – INTRODUCTION TO WATER SKILLS

Approximately 6 thru teens. Class size is 3 to 6 students; front and back glides and recover to a vertical position; roll from front to back and back to front, back float; tread water using arm and hand actions; alternating and simultaneous arm and leg actions on front and back; combined arm and leg actions.

LEVEL 2 – FUNDAMENTAL AQUATIC SKILLS

Approximately 6 thru teens. Class size is 3 to 6 students; front, jellyfish, and tuck floats, rotary breathing; front and back glide and recover to a vertical position; roll from front to back and back to front, tread water using arm and leg actions; change direction of travel while swimming on front or back; combined arm and leg actions on front and back; finning arm action.

LEVEL 3 – STROKE DEVELOPMENT

Approximately 6 thru teens. Class size is 3 to 6 students; rotary breathing; headfirst entries from the side in sitting and kneeling positions; back float, survival float, rotary breathing, and treading water; change from vertical to horizontal position on front and back; flutter and dolphin kicks on front; scissors and breaststroke kicks, front crawl, and elementary backstroke.

LEVEL 4 – STROKE IMPROVEMENT

Approximately 6 thru teens. Class size is 3 to 6 students; headfirst entries from the side in compact and stride positions; swim under water, feet-first surface dive, survival swimming; open turns on front and back, tread water using 2 different kicks; front and back crawl, elementary backstroke, breaststroke, sidestroke and butterfly, flutter and dolphin kicks on back.

ADULT

Teens thru adults. Class size is 3 to 6 students. Intended for teens and adults who wish to improve their knowledge and skill for many reasons: could be to overcome fear of water or to improve skill and technique; beginners can learn skills including submerging eyes, mouth, and nose, front and back glides, back floats, rolling from front to back and back to front, rotary breathing, and combined arm and leg actions on front and back; advanced swimmers can focus on skills of their choice including but not limited to improving skill and technique for freestyle, backstroke, breaststroke, butterfly, sidestroke, and flip turns.

SEA BATHERS ERUPTION (SEA LICE)

WHAT IS IT?

Ocean bathers report red welts and blotches, which are concentrated under the swimsuit and other parts of the body after swimming in the ocean. Itching and redness usually occur several hours after ocean bathing. Some experience a slight "prickling" sensation while they are in the water. This occurs mostly from April to July

SYMPTOMS AND TREATMENT

Itching: usually lasts 2-4 days but can last as long as 2 weeks. Some people have more severe reactions, including headache, fever, nausea, and infected blisters. Children may develop high fever. An oral antihistamine may help to relieve the itching. Also, an over-the-counter topical 1% cortisone cream or sting aid may be helpful. With severe reactions or complications, call your physician immediately. For more information, call (561) 514-5369, HRS-Palm Beach County Public Health Unit.

PREVENTION

Make sure you change out of your bathing suit before showering. This may reduce your risk for sea bather's eruption by half.

GENERAL INFORMATION

The 9-hole, 1357-yard course provides breathtaking views of the Intracoastal Waterway and Atlantic Ocean and has holes ranging from 64 to 227 yards in length. The course was designed by Charles Ankrom and offers tees, fairways, and greens with Seashore Paspalum grass, which provides bright, vibrant color and superior playing surfaces. Amenities include pull cart rental, outings and leagues, vending machines, electric golf cart rental, practice putting green, and club rental.

Resident: For the Alan C. Alford Red Reef Golf Course, a resident is a person residing within the Greater Boca Raton Beach and Park District (includes the City of Boca Raton).

PERMIT AND ID CARDS

Rates for the Alan C. Alford Red Reef Course and the Municipal Executive Course are identical.

Resident ID Cards are \$25 and good up to 2 years or until the Glades Road facility closes (or at the expiration of any lease provided, not exceeding 2 years) and for 2 years at Red Reef.

For residents of the City of Boca Raton and the Greater Boca Raton Beach and Park District, renewals and new permit or ID card applicants must provide proof of residency. Proof of residency shall include both a driver's license or photo ID and current tax or utility bill with name and address. Other acceptable proof of residency includes current vehicle registration, lease agreement, Declaration of Domicile, mortgage statement, property tax receipt, or letter from the Director of Campus Housing.

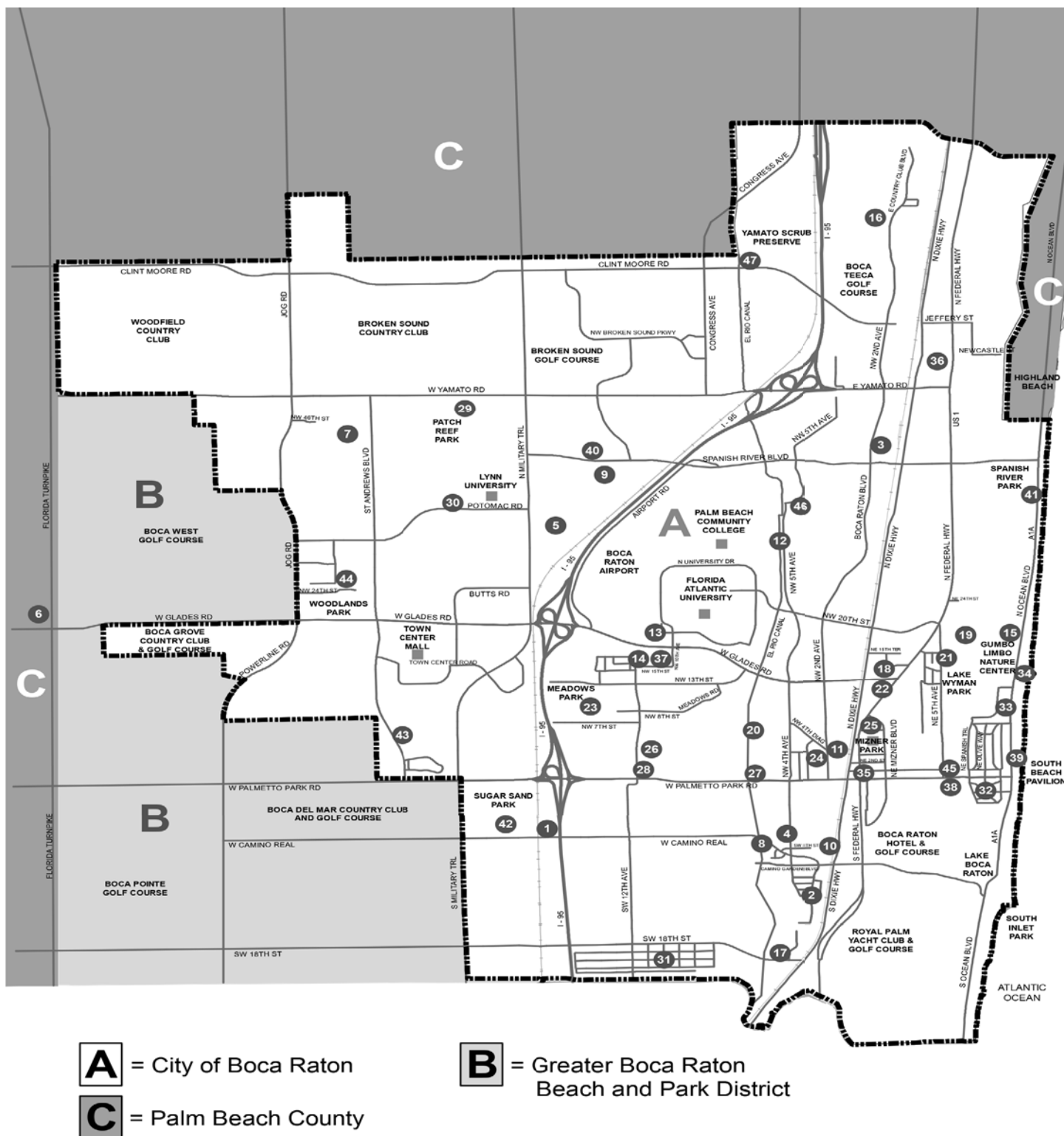
