Sugar Sand Getting Animated

The Boca Raton community can release and explore its creative side by visiting the new Animationland exhibit at Sugar Sand Park's Science Explorium. Children can join Tracey the pencil dog and her friends as they guide visitors through a magical world of hands-on interactive exhibits that reveal the secrets behind the art of animation. Animationland empowers visitors of all ages to experiment, learn, and tell their own stories through animation. Animationland's interactive features include a sketching studio, a sound effects booth and the opportunity to plan and star in a stop-motion production. Developed and produced by the Oregon Museum of Science and Industry, Animationland will entertain visitors through December.



Being Cool To The Schools

Almost from its inception, the Greater Boca Raton Beach and Park District eagerly partnered with educational entities to enhance Boca Raton community life.

Created in 1974 to help the City of Boca Raton retire the debt incurred from the purchase of the Schine Tract, District Commissioner Gordon Gilbert pushed to ensure part of that land would become what is now the Gumbo Limbo Nature Center.

Gumbo Limbo opened in 1984, offering the Boca Raton community an opportunity to learn about the flora and fauna that occupy the hammock east of the Intracoastal.

Riding a tidal wave of public momentum, District Commissioners fully embraced pickleball in 2021. While pickleball could be played at certain times inside the Sugar Sand Park field house, in 2021 Commissioners provided full time, dedicated courts by converting two Patch Reef Park tennis courts into six pickleball courts. Commissioners added another half dozen pickleball courts earlier this year. A few weeks ago the District committed to pickleball even further by beginning construction on an 18-court, covered pickleball facility at Patch Reef. And Boca Paddle is currently in the process of building an indoor facility at North Park. Pickleball in Boca Raton is here to stay - a welcoming that took hold in 2021.



StoryWalk's Butterfly Magic
