The preventative maintenance finished on schedule. Carousel operating hours are:

Now-Aug 31: Tues.-Fri.: 3-7pm,

Sat.-Sun.: 11am-4pm Sept. 1 onward: Tues.-Fri.: 3-7pm,

Sat.-Sun.: 8:30am-4:30pm

Carousel riders can climb aboard 30 horses and two chariots, one of which is wheelchair accessible. The carousel is located next to the Science Playground.



Park Pickleball Progress



Millage Rate Not Rising

District Commissioners voted in July not to raise the proposed millage rate for next year. Commissioners chose to keep the proposed rate at 1.08 mills for the fourth consecutive year. Moving forward, that rate can not be raised for the upcoming year. By law, Commissioners must wait at least 30 days from the initial vote before proposing a formal resolution to adopt the rate. That meeting, along with the first public hearing on budget and taxes, is scheduled for Wednesday, Sept. 3 at 6 p.m. in the District conference room. The millage rate and budget are expected to be adopted at a dedicated meeting on Sept. 15 at 6 p.m. The millage rate is used to determine property taxes paid to the District. Under the proposed rate, homeowners would pay \$1.08 for every \$1,000 of their home's value as assessed by the Palm Beach County tax collector.



Boca's Picture Park-fect

Boca Raton's two major pickleball projects are moving closer to fruition. At Patch Reef Park, crews are applying the playing surface layers and installing the sound system for the 18-court covered facility. The final construction step creating additional parking – is expected to begin shortly. Patch Reef's covered pickleball facility is scheduled to open for smashes and dinks this fall. At North Park, Boca Paddle is moving forward on the creation of its indoor pickleball and padel facility. Boca Paddle held the facility's groundbreaking in July. Crews and heavy equipment are already moving earth.

Two photographs taken at Districtsupported Red Reef Park earned top honors in the City of Boca Raton's Snap the Park photo contest. Crystal Conway captured sunrise over the ocean at Red Reef to win Best Overall entry. John Dwyer's photo of a palm tree and a person gazing over the ocean claimed the People's Choice award. 
