North Park Featured Presentations Ready


Golf amenities, a surf park, and youth recreational facilities are some of the features that will be proposed for North Park during presentations at Sugar Sand Park's Willow Theatre on Oct. 6-7.

Nine companies responded to the Greater Boca Raton Beach and Park District's request for recreational facility proposals. All will be provided the opportunity to convince District Commissioners that their proposal fills a need on North Park's west side or a portion of the east side.

"We're excited to see the proposals for North Park features," District Chair Erin Wright said. "It looks like we'll have some interesting ideas."

Each company will have 10 minutes to make their presentation. Commissioners will question the presenters following each presentation. Members of the Boca Raton community will have the opportunity to express their opinions at the conclusion of each evening.

The ribbon-cutting ceremony will feature giveaways and other surprises, and open play follows the ceremony.

North Park's Traffic Garden officially opened to entertain and educate young Boca Raton bicyclists with an early September ribbon-cutting ceremony attended by District Commissioners and several members of the Boca Raton City Council.

Millage Holds Steady Again

District Commissioners officially voted at their Sept. 15 TRIM meeting to keep the millage rate at 1.08 for next year. This is the fourth consecutive year adopting that same millage rate. Commissioners also approved the fiscal year 2025-26 budget at that dedicated meeting. The millage rate is used to determine property taxes. Revenue generated during this upcoming fiscal year is expected to help fund projects such as the creation of additional fields at Spanish River Athletic Park, design of a second

Getting The Point

Tennis and pickleball players now have a new way to reserve courts, register for programs and pay online at the Boca Raton Racquet Center and the Patch Reef Paddle and Racquet Club. Earlier this month those facilities switched to the Playbypoint system for reservations and clinics. First time Playbypoint users can create their free profiles at www.playbypoint.com. Once registered, users can add the Racquet Center and the Paddle and Racquet Club to their account. Newly registered users may have to provide proof of residency or membership in person at the pro shop. Players can also use Playbypoint to reserve courts and register for programs at city-owned Boca Raton Tennis Center. community field house, North Park development, the Patch Reef Park tennis court rebuild and various other maintenance projects.



One More Sunday Funday

There's still one Sunday's worth of free carousel rides remaining at Sugar Sand Park. Throughout September Boca Raton celebrated the 20th anniversary of the iconic carousel's arrival at Sugar Sand by offering free rides on Sundays. Sept. 28 marks the final Sunday of the month. The community is encouraged to visit the carousel during its normal Sunday operating hours, 8:30 a.m.-4:30 p.m. On other days of the week, riders can still collect special limited edition tokens celebrating the carousel. Carousel riders can climb aboard 30 horses and two chariots, one of which is wheelchair accessible. The carousel is located next to the Science Playground, near the Sugar Sand community center.
