## SKATEPARK DESIGN APPROVED

Airwalks, boardslides and kick flips moved a step closer to North Park when Greater Boca Raton Beach and Park District commissioners unanimously approved design plans for a new skatepark.

"I think this is amazing and I think it's going to serve so many people," Commissioner Erin Wright said. "I think it's going to be huge asset to the community."

A loud cheer erupted from project supporters when Commissioners gave their approval following a presentation by Plant-A-Park and the Platform Group at the January 20 public meeting.

"I'm blown away by your presentation and your enthusiasm," Commissioner Bob Rollins said. "This is a wonderful-looking project."

The 42,000 square foot skatepark will be located next to Boca Paddle, south of Jeffrey St. tucked into the area east of NW 2nd Ave. All of the skating features are more than 300 feet away from residences, and noise reduction measures - including trees and landscaping - are incorporated into the design. The design team prioritized maintaining green space and shade trees.

CAP enhances quality of life for persons with disabilities and their families by fostering community-building programs, providing resources, and offering education and training.
